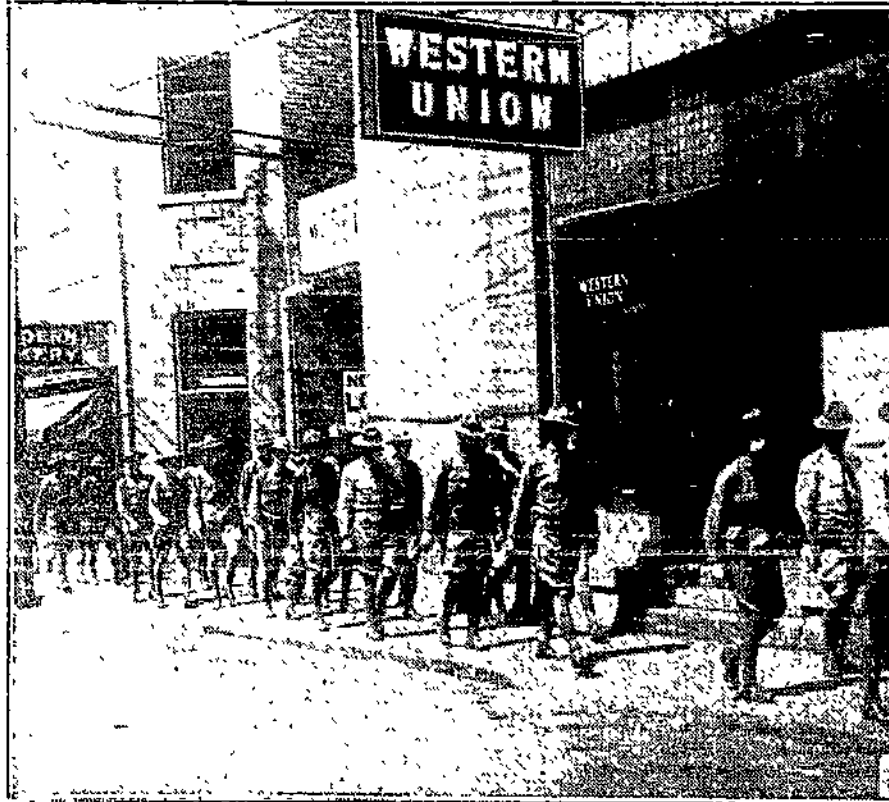
Troops Guard Run-off Polls In Kentucky

800 Militiamen Take Charge of Harlan County Voting

Ordered by Laffoon Feared Mob Violence Over Dynamite Slaying of Prosecutor

Frankfort, Ky., Sept. 7 (AP)—Eight hundred Kentucky national guardsmen marched into Harlan County today, took over the reins of government in the town of Wallin and patrolled voting places over the county in the Democratic run-off primary election.

Utica, Sept. 7 (AP)—Immediate repeal of the State milk control law was sought today by representatives of independent dairymen, who urged a special session of the Legislature if no other way can be found to strike the regulations from the State's statute books.

Soldiers Ordered Not To Interfere With Vote

Harlan, Ky., Sept. 7 (AP)—Armed with rifles and sidearms, 700 Kentucky National Guardsmen were deployed today to most of Harlan County's 72 voting places with instructions to prevent strife but not to interfere with the Democratic gubernatorial run-off primary.

After a conference with Sheriff Theodore B. Middleton, who opposed troop occupation of his county in the courts, Lieut. Col. John A. Polin of Springfield, senior officer in charge here, said today that only the Sheriff Middleton concurred.

American Family's Liquor Bill Put at \$97.29 Since Repeal

Atlantic City, N. J., Sept. 7 (UP)—The average American family has spent \$97.29 for legal liquor in the last two years, Mrs. Ida B. Wise Smith, national president of the W. C. T. U., told 1,000 delegates to the annual convention at its opening session last night.

Mrs. Smith put the nation's drink bill for 1934 at \$3,000,000,000 and said the Government realized \$14.97 per family in revenue.

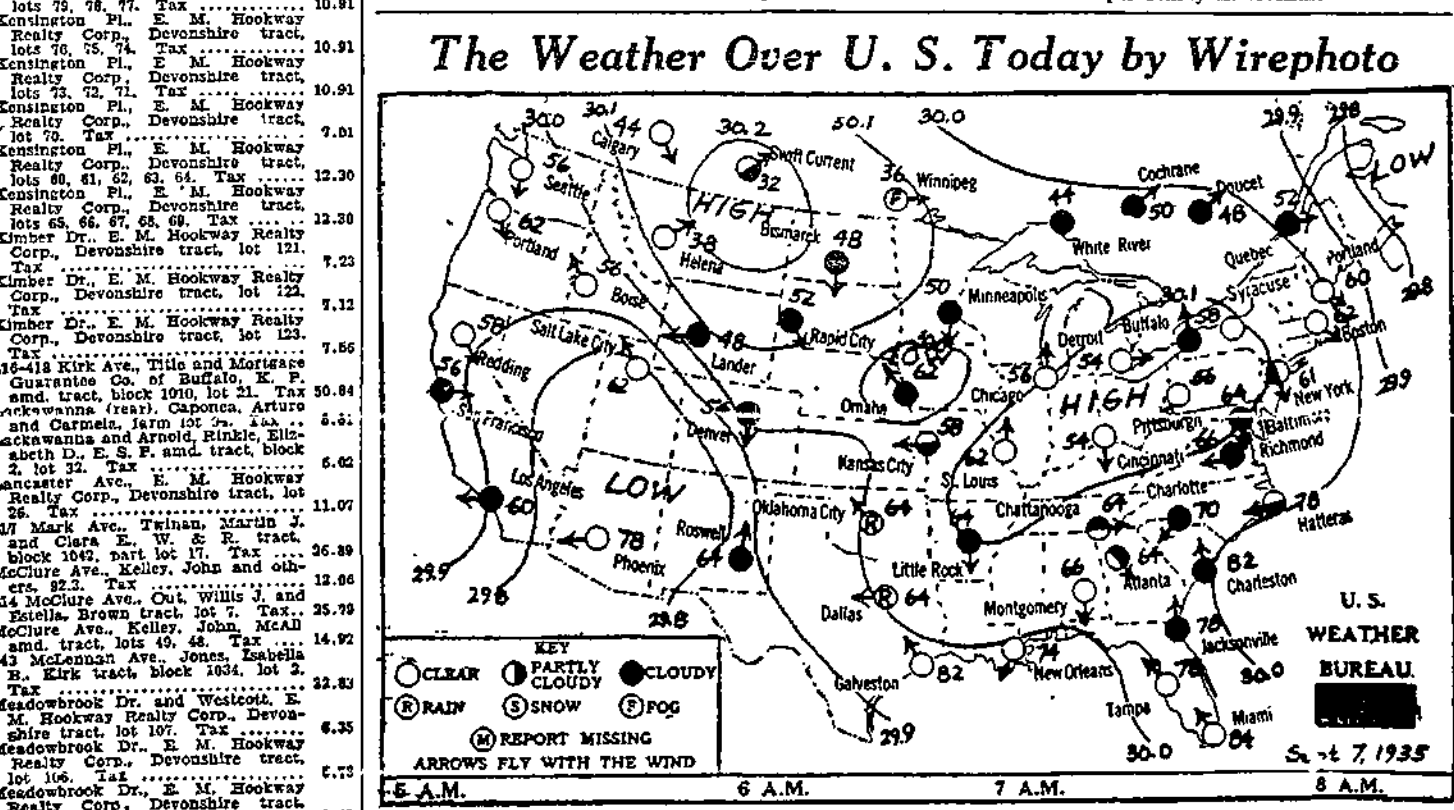
