SUC Offers Field Biology Scholarships

OSWEGO—State University College at Oswego will offer State Education Department scholarship courses in field biology during both the fall and spring semester.

The course, to be taught each Saturday from 8:30 to 11 a.m. beginning Sept. 28, will be taught by John Weeks and Dr. Carlita Georgia. The State Scholarship grants cover tuition and fees in full. Applicants must have been regularly assigned elementary or secondary teachers of science or mathematics during the 1962-63 academic year, with at least three years' teaching experience.

Dr. Vernon Rank, director of extension, will certify to the State Education Department the participants who are entitled to state grants. Payments will be made to the participant through the college.
